Investiture Ceremony



Field Trip to Rangashankara



College and Career Guidance Initiatives


In July, the College and Career Guidance (CCG) department organized several key programs and activities designed to support our students' academic and career aspirations. Here's a summary of the month's initiatives:



Embracing Failure: A Stepping Stone to Success

To most people, failure is the greatest setback to business. But looking closer, you will realize that most successful entrepreneurs and companies have had great flops before achieving greatness. By examining a few of these failures, we can uncover valuable lessons that illuminate the path to success.

First of all, let's talk about why **marketing research** is important. This is something very important because at the end, the majority of businesses fail since there is a lack of knowledge about the markets. A typical example is that of New Coke, which was launched in 1985. The company Coca-Cola, as an expansion strategy, changed a century-old formula to a sweeter one. The backlash was almost instantaneous and fierce. What the customers wanted is to get their original Coke back, but instead, they were given Coca-Cola Classic. This fiasco showed how, perhaps, the most gigantic companies in the world could not properly get what the real needs of its consumers were.

Another common reason for business failures is the lack of a clear and **adaptable business model**. Take the case of Blockbuster: in its time, this company was the place for movie rentals. However, it failed in the matter of digital streaming.

Netflix started with a DVD mail service but very quickly moved into streaming, making an absolute game-changer in the way people consume media. Blockbuster had no foresight regarding such changes and thus was done for.

Overexpansion is another pitfall that has led to the collapse of many businesses. Such is the example of the fast growth of Borders: the company, already in the 90s, and even before the year 2000, began aggressively increasing the number of its stores, not even suspecting some threats from the rapidly growing business of selling books online, not to mention the future financial crisis. Coupled with the fact that the number of outlets over-expanded and, of course, completely coupled with a lack of investment in online sales, it eventually led to their going bust in 2011. Finally, **lack of innovation** can be a sealed fate for a company. Kodak, once a giant in the photography business, came up with the digital camera but hesitated to develop it, thinking that it was its own film business that the camera would cannibalize.

This ensured their rivals would benefit from digital photography—the fall of Kodak. In other words, what can actually be learned from these failures? First of all, get to know your market. Do not assume in any case what clients want unless there is very detailed research. Second, be flexible. The environment is always changing, and flexibility is what sometimes makes the difference between failure and success. Grow, but grow smartly. Yes, growth is necessary, but to grow out of sheer ambition without a clear plan may be fatal in business.

Lastly, **welcome innovation**. The world is dynamic, and businesses have to change with it in order to remain relevant. Remember the saying: Failure is not an end but a valuable instructor. One learns from such failures that move one towards smarter strategies and more resilient business models. Remember, **every failure carries a seed of success—it's up to you to make it grow.**
